Micah 6:8, taking now a third Sunday to consider this challenge: 3 straightforward commands by God. We've considered doing justly (not just wanting it or complaining about it); loving mercy (not just having mercy but being merciful); walking humbly.

1. Let's dig into this a bit and see we can't make humility our forte as well.

✓ It's a walk, "Walk Humbly," it's not a sprint or a jog, it's a walk; this implies sameness, a continual thing. It's every day and it's all day. It conveys friendship, common understanding, common agenda, side by side, going the same direction as God is, **Amos 3:3.** It's not possible to walk 'Proudly' with God. Those two things are mutually exclusive.

2. "Blessed are the Meek for they shall inherit the earth."

- ✓ "The Meek will be all that's left here; none of the others will make it through." Humility means being precisely the person we actually are before God.
- ✓ Happy are those who are realistic about their sin. Happy are those who are repentant about their sin. Happy are those who humble themselves before the Holy God.
- ✓ The Greek = gentle, patient, submissive. Like a horse that has been saddle broken. (The power is still there!) It is not weakness; it is power under control. It is what the Spirit of God produces in us, Galatians 5:22-23.

3. A Characteristic of Christ, 2nd Corinthians 10:1, Matthew 11:29-30.

✓ It's not "he can't defend himself;" he just doesn't. Jesus was mistreated in every way, but He didn't defend Himself. Jesus didn't defend Himself, but He took a whip and ran every money changer and seller out of the temple!

Meekness doesn't worry about his own injuries. No need to defend his rights. It is not about defending one's own rights, but letting God become our defender.
