## 1. What is the book of Acts?

<u>1. Unique book in the N. T. ---</u> All the previous books are Gospels and all the following books are letters Acts is neither in fact it is the bridge between the two.

- 2. Partial fulfillment of: Jn. 14:12
- <u>3. Part 2 of a 2-part series of writings by a first century doctor named Luke.</u>
  --<u>He wrote more lines in the N. T</u>. than any other writer including Paul.
  --<u>By all accounts, Luke is the only</u> Spirit inspired writer of the Scriptures who was not Jewish.
- 4. it is a <u>Part 2, but in some respects it isn't</u>:

--<u>Acts is not really the sequel</u>—<u>it is only the trailer</u> to the real sequel. The real sequel is US!!!!!

--<u>The world has seen part One</u> now they desperately need to see part Two and that is up to us.

## 3. Acts paints a picture of a church that is quite different than most churches we're used to.

- Spirit directed ---- We are seeing a lot of the activity of the Spirit in our churches, but He is operating like a partner in a business instead of the out-right **OWNER**.
  - --<u>Paul</u> before he received the call to cross over to Macedonia said, <u>Acts 16:6-7</u>
  - --<u>What kind of evangelism strategy is that?</u> A Spirit led one!!!
  - --Another thing, have you ever noticed who gave the altar calls in Acts?
  - --<u>Peter preaching on the day of Pentecost</u> --- The crowd broke in and said, <u>Acts 2:37</u>.
  - --<u>Again, Paul and Silas</u> having a worship service in a Philippian jail and the jailer rushes in after God demonstrates His presence and says "Sirs what must I do to be saved?"

## <u>4. Acts is a misnamed book – Called the Acts of the Apostles in most</u> <u>translations, I think, it is misnamed.</u>

- --<u>First, it covers the acts of only 2 apostles</u> (Peter, and Paul) and none of the others.
- --<u>The two most prominent figures besides aforementioned</u> were not apostles but deacons (Stephen and Phillip occupy a full 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> chapters of Acts)

--<u>Even more than these, Luke's own intro</u>. to his book requires us to rename it: <u>Acts 1:1</u> "all that Jesus began to do"

→ I think a better name for Acts would be "The Acts of Jesus Christ"---a name to which I think Paul would agree.

--Having well over 1/2 the book written about him --- Paul says this

about his ministry: Rom. 15:18-19

--Key word here in verse 1 is "began"

--<u>Acts is what Jesus continued to do</u> --- **still alive—still active**, He's just changed bodies, from physical to spiritual.

--<u>Today, how far has Jesus moved</u>? Moved into you and me and now He's moving us into world that does know Him.

--<u>Acts has no real ending</u> because it is still being written as Jesus works His acts through us---what part will you play?
