Acts of Jesus, Lesson 17: Martyrdom

- > <u>Do you realize that we are coming off the worst</u> century in Christian history as far as Christians being martyred for their faith is concerned?
- Martyrdom is not some bygone issue for the Church; it is a current issue and it has always been to a greater or lesser degree for the Church since the beginning.

1. <u>Today we're going to be looking at a person named Stephen - a believer, a deacon, and the first martyr of the Church.</u>

- > Acts 6:8-15
 - First of all, what is a martyr?
 - Our word comes from the Greek word martus, which means simply witness.
- > Acts 1:8 "and you will be My martyrs..." is the actual Greek of that verse.
 - In time, it came to apply solely to those who witnessed for the Savior in their deaths.
 - <u>Technically, "Martyr" is not special classification</u> among believers but a categorical one!!

2. What constitutes a martyr? We have an excellent example in this man called **Stephen**.

- 1. First of all, a martyr is a person full of faith. V. 5
 - What does it mean that Stephen was full of faith?
 - I think that the right interpretation of this lies with the other thing he was filled with "full of faith and the Holy Spirit."
 - <u>Can't have more of the Spirit</u>, but you can be more under His control
 - <u>Similarly, it's not a matter of more faith, necessarily</u>, but it's of a matter of being controlled by faith.
 - "Walk by faith and not by sight" is not a matter more faith in the sense of measure but more faith in sense of control.
 - There is no real power in faith itself only in the object of faith.
 - <u>If your faith is something that has no power</u> or is known to fail, then your faith is worthless.
 - Faith is powerful when the object of faith is God and His Word because God is powerful!!
 - Faith is walking in the will of God confident in the sustaining power of God.
 - Does faith control your life?
- 2. Secondly, a martyr is a person who knows the Book.
 - <u>Notice:</u> Stephen <u>proceeds to give a lengthy and pinpoint accurate</u> Bible lecture to the Sanhedrin who have the equivalent of doctor degrees in theology (the longest speech in Acts).
- 3. Finally, a martyr is a person who is dead already!!
 - Which is harder: To die for Christ or to live every single day for Him?
 - The price of living every single day for Him is often much higher!!
 - In either case, its martyrdom: Rom. 12:1
 - Paul writes this about his life lived for Christ: Gal. 2:20
