Acts of Jesus, Lesson 20: Following God's Lead

- We are going to be taking a look at the events that transpire in the life of Philip the Evangelist (deacon=man filled with the Spirit of God and wisdom) over a relatively short period time and draw some lessons from his life about what it means to follow God's lead.
- Acts 8:1, 4-5, -- Notice the first way God moves Philip circumstances...in fact bad circumstances out of simple necessity Philip finds himself in Samaria. God leads through circumstances.
- ➤ Acts 8:26-30 Notice the second way God moves Philip Extraordinary circumstances...he sees and angel and hears the voice of the Holy Spirit.
 - Does God still lead this way?
- Acts 8:39-40 Notice the third way God moves Philip literally picks him up takes him to a new place with no further instructions
- > "This must be where I'm supposed to be, because this is where I am." And he went right about doing what God had given for him to do.

1. The question that we are going to answer together this morning is: How can we know God's Will and direction for our lives so we can follow His lead?

- Philip had it easy you don't need to deliberate when your circumstances leave you only one option or when an angel appears, or the Spirit speaks to you audibly.
- This is by far the exception rather than the rule --- 99% of the time and 99% of situations God's will is not so easily discerned.
- ➤ How do we know His will when the fog is thick?
- 1. We are actually assuming something here: that we really want to know and do His will.
 - o So, do we?
 - Donald Grey Barnhouse "95% of knowing the will of God consists in being willing to do it before you know what it is."
 - Do you really believe that God knows what He's doing and that what He's doing is the best thing for you?
- 2. Once you've overcome the obstacle of your will, the next step is memorizing the rule book!!
 - Reading and dwelling on it and holding it close to your heart is absolutely imperative for when you're flying in the fog.
 - <u>Listen carefully</u> to what God says about His Word: <u>Joshua 1:8, Ps. 1:1-2;</u> <u>2 Timothy</u>
 <u>3:16-17</u>
 - Without a firm commitment to the rule book, you're not going to make it.
- 3. The third step = Ask for Guidance.
 - May sound like something we shouldn't have to be told to do, but in reality though we ask God something we are not really asking for guidance.
 - A lot of the time when we ask God to show us what to do, we are really saying "let me know that what I want to do is O.K."
 - o Asking for guidance is really leaving the options all to God.
- 4. The fourth step is to expect an answer.
 - o God answers through a number of media:
 - 1. Through His Word "
 - 2. Through Prayer -
 - 3. Through His Church.
 - 4. <u>Through Circumstances</u> closed doors, open doors (opportunity)
 - 5. <u>Through the supernatural</u> this is rare... many go their whole lives following the Lord faithfully and never once hear any audible voice.
