## **Acts of Jesus, Lesson 22: Common Ground**

> We are going read about a very prominent Christian who came face to face with his own misconceptions and prejudices.

## 1. Turn with me to Acts Ch. 10

- ▶ <u>V. 1</u> This man is an Italian and he is in charge of 100 Roman soldiers in a coastal community in Israel about where Tel Aviv is today.
- ▶ V. 2-6 There are several things to touch on here:
- a. "If Jesus is the only way, what about the person who has never heard about Jesus?"
  - What we have here is the starting place of a definitive answer.
  - <u>This centurion had not met Jesus</u> or heard of His saving work, but he was <u>living up to the light he had.</u>
  - Rom. 1:19-20 God has given clear evidence of His existence through the creation...enough to leave every person without excuse.
  - <u>The creation screams there is a God,</u> if they don't listen to that; they won't listen to your preaching.
- b. But living up to the light they have still does not save them...so what then?
  - This clearly illustrates that God will go to great lengths to get the gospel to them.
- c. Here's another question for you: Why didn't the angel give Cornelius the gospel?
  - God has no other program by which He is communicating the gospel except through His church.
- > <u>VV. 13-14</u> This vision happened three times:
  - There 2 things we can know from this little episode:
    - 1. These animals were not kosher this is why Peter raises an objection.
    - 2. Peter is not as far along in his theology as maybe we thought.
      - You don't call Him Lord and say "No" to Him!!
      - Peter's problem was that his idea of God was not the same as God's idea of God.
    - 3. <u>This vision Peter gets is to prepare him to speak</u> to the Gentile Cornelius who is in a sense as unclean to him as the animals on that sheet.
- ➤ <u>Be satisfied with the Scriptures</u>, pour yourself into the Scriptures, God speaks first and primarily through the Scriptures.
- > <u>Don't pursue visions</u>...if God wants to give you a vision, He knows where to find you!!
- > <u>VV. 17, 22</u> God who was working on Cornelius was also working on Peter thoughts to move him to Cornelius.
  - We don't miss the opportunities God is bringing our way to speak to those He's already working on.
- > <u>VV. 23-25</u> <u>Cornelius is still a pagan, don't mistake it...</u>he needs to hear about Jesus!!
- > <u>VV. 26-28</u> <u>That was a big step!!</u> This was the first time Peter had ever been in a Gentile house.
  - <u>The distance across that threshold further</u> than most missionaries go today, because it was so taboo for Peter to be there.
  - <u>I can practically guarantee you that Peter did not think of himself a prejudiced...If anything,</u> he thought of himself as very progressive having over seen the mission to the Samaritans in recent days.
  - I say that to say that I don't think our real prejudices are realized either.
  - <u>Church down here has got to look like church up there:</u> No racial, economic, occupational, age, dress requirements.
