Acts of Jesus, Lesson 24: This World Needs a "But"!

What's in a name? Our series in the book of Acts and considering the first place where followers of Jesus were called Christians.

1. Acts 12:1

- The name Herod is a name that is pretty much synonymous with bad people in history.
- 1. <u>Herod the Great</u> had his wife (one of many) murdered and then had his two sons executed because they found out about his part in the murder.
 - The Emperor of Rome at the time joked that it was safer to be Herod's pig than to be his son.
 - <u>He did lots of other atrocities not the least</u> of which was having every male child in the vicinity of Bethlehem killed in an attempt to kill the baby Jesus.
- 2. <u>Herod Archelaus</u> (Son of Herod the Great) his cruelty was the reason God sent Joseph and Mary back to Nazareth instead of Bethlehem after they left Egypt.
- 3. <u>Herod Antipas</u> (Son of Herod the Great) was the guy who stole his brother Phillip's wife against which John the Baptist preached for which Antipas had his head removed from his shoulders.
- 4. Herod Agrippa I (Son of Antipas and grandson of Herod the Great) is the villain of this story.
- 5. Herod Agrippa II is the Herod we find mentioned at the Paul's trial
- 6. at the end of the book of Acts.

2. Let's take a look at what I think is an all-important question "Does our world have a 'but'?"

- "But" as in a conjunction not a part of the anatomy.
- As we're going to see it is a "but" that makes all the difference in our story and all the difference in our lives and the world we live in.
- Acts 12:1-2 -- These two brothers form the book ends if you will for the ministries of the apostles James is the first of the apostles to die (in 44 A.D. we know the year because it's the same year Herod dies which is well documented in Roman and Jewish history) John is the last near 100 A.D.
- Acts 12:1-11
- This little conjunction "but" is the all important word in this story.
- Not to say they didn't pray, but this is the first time we hear of the church concertedly praying for one of theirs's who's in a tight place.
- This stands out especially in the contrast in this story:
 - 1. James is imprisoned and there is no indication of prayer James loses his head.
 - 2. <u>It is very clear that the Spirit intended for us to "blame" the release</u> Of Peter on the prayers of the church.
 - What would be the likely outcome be of this story? Peter dies....**BUT!!!!!**
 - James' death got the church's attention.
 - The difference between James and Peter is that Peter had a "BUT".!!!
 - God has chosen to limit Himself and the ministry He does to the prayers and ministry of His people.
 - This fact is demonstrated in several places and in various ways:
 - 1. The Church is called the Body of Christ, the Spirit of Christ dwells in her.
 - Likewise, Jesus does almost everything He does through His Body.
 - 2. There is something in Jeremiah that is very provocative: <u>Jer. 14:11</u> Why? <u>How do our</u> prayers affect the Almighty???? ... <u>James 4:2!!!</u>
 - <u>Do we realize how a large a part believers' play in the goodness and blessings</u> that our world enjoys?
 - Jesus said we are light of world and the salt of earth.
 - Without believers praying and caring and ministering, the world comes apart.
 - <u>Bad people get worse</u>/ <u>cruel and horrible things increase</u>/ no one intervenes for the helpless/ lives that are messed up never get fixed.

3. We are the only chance for a "but" that this world has.

- We need to be a "but" for each other.
- We need to be the "but" for our world.
- God has no other program of ministry but His church!!
- The only light the only salt, the only chance at a "but" that our world around us has is us
