(4) Luke 6:27-31; We saw last time in looking at Jesus' commands for His Kingdom that we've been called to a different life and way than out world.
${ }^{4}$ ) Under the blessings of the kingdom Jesus tells us to rejoice we are persecuted, hated, and mistreated, but we don't stop there, we reach out to our persecutors in love: verses 27-31.
${ }^{4}$ ) The goal of the average person is to get rid of his enemies and that is our goal as well, but we do it God's way-He prefers turning them into friends.
${ }^{4}$ ) The only way to overcome hate, animosity, bitterness, resentment is not fighting fire with fire-we overcome it with love.
${ }^{4}$ Loving enemies is impossible apart from God's strength and filling, but we undergird and supernatural message by the demonstration of a supernatural life.
$\stackrel{4}{4}$ Matthew 5:46-48 Perfection is definitely supernatural!
${ }^{4}$ A Supernatural life is summed up in commands of Jesus's kingdom: love your enemies, do good those who hate you, bless those how curse you, pray for those who mistreat you

## Starts with our attitude: love.

$\checkmark$ How we feel is often the caboose of the train and not the engine: in other words, how, we feel often follows how we act.
$\checkmark$ Love gives way to more action: "Do Good," the ultimate good is to wish them to be in Heaven with you.
$\checkmark$ Attitude: love; Action: reach out; Bless; specifically refers to what we say, "bless those who curse you."
$\checkmark$ Biblical blessings: Numbers 6:24-26; Psalms 20:4; 1 ${ }^{\text {st }}$ Thessalonians 3:12; $2^{\text {nd }}$ Thessalonians 3:16; Ephesians 3:17b.
$\checkmark$ Jesus spoke while they were nailing Him to the cross:
$\checkmark$ Luke 23:34; Acts 7:60; Pray for them: along the same lines as blessings them, but in private to God.
