#### **Acts of Jesus, Lesson 26: Signs from the Heavens**

## 1. We're going to take a look at what I am calling "Signs from the Heavens": understanding God's leading as we reach out to a lost world.

- We saw last time here in Chapter 13 the spread of the gospel changed from a "accidental" mode to an intentional mode in which God specifically calls out and leads out in reaching our world for Christ.
- But how do you know what God is leading you to do and where HE's leading you to do it.??

# 2. What I'm going to do is make several observations about God's leadership that come out of this first segment of the first missionary journey. Acts 13:1-4

- 1. <u>The first observation to make here is one that I made</u> in the previous sermon on God's guidance: God's guidance comes to those who are really seeking it. **Verse 2** 
  - This brings us back to the operative question: **Do we really want His guidance?**
  - <u>Like last time, we</u> don't seek this Spirit's voice often because we don't like what He says.
  - <u>The starting point of God's guidance</u> is a passionate commitment to do whatever he says.
  - You sign a blank check and you allow God to fill in all the details.
  - Which is why so few do great things for His kingdom.
- 2. This second observation: God doesn't give us all the details, but He leads us through our desires.
  - **VV.3-5** First there is clear guidance but no details.
  - How did they decide to go to Cyprus?
  - <u>Doesn't take much detective work to put two and two together here:</u> Barnabas is from Cyprus and John Mark is his nephew.
  - We want this to say that God specifically directs them to Cyprus, but it doesn't say that.
  - We want it to say that because we want God to direct our lives that way and the fact is He doesn't always.
  - Let's consider 2 verses: one for the O.T. and the other from the N.T.:
    - Ps. 37:4 This is not a recipe for getting what I want but for getting what God wants!
    - o **Jn. 15:7** Again, this is not a recipe for getting what you want!!!
    - God's Word changes my desires to fit His!!
  - God's purpose in our lives as we live them down here is two-fold:
    - o One, to reach a world that does not know Him.
    - $\circ\quad \underline{\text{Two}}\text{, to draw us into a devoted love relationship with Him that is based on trust.}$
  - <u>If He gives us all the details, then</u> we won't rely on Him but instead will rely on the directions.

### God leads them out by their desires...having delighted themselves in the Lord.

- 3. <u>Our third observation gives a second way God leads: through the confirmation of</u> other believers.
  - <u>VV. 2-3</u> -- not to say that God had not already been moving the hearts of Paul and Barnabas but notice that their decision was not made in a vacuum just between them and God.

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- The church was also involved in their decision.
- <u>Interesting that when Paul received his original call</u> at his conversion God intentionally involved another believer = Ananias.
- Why? Because Christians are not independent but interdependent the Body of Christ.
- <u>In the Body of Christ, the foot does have mind of its own</u> and is in its own personal relationship with God, but it is not independent of the Body.
- We have a strong tendency to bring our American, independent, "I can go it alone" mentality into our Christian walk.
- "Just me and God is all I need to make any and all my decisions" says Who? Not God or His Word.
- An independent Christian is like an independent body part == a freak of nature.
- Though I can think for myself and though I ultimately answer only to God, I need to be in submission to other believers **Eph. 5:21**.

#### 4. A third way God leads is through our experiences.

- What had Paul and Barnabas been doing prior to this?? Acts 11:26, 12:25
- <u>There is a pattern there:</u>
  - 1. Helped start a church,
  - 2. <u>Sent out as a representative of a church.</u>
  - 3. <u>You also have Paul's call in Damascus.</u> (callings and gifts of God are without repentance)
  - 4. They are also both born in Gentile lands
- <u>These were not random experiences</u>...they were preparing them.
- What is God preparing you for?
- Make a list of your experiences with God from the time you were saved till now.
- Listing every time God either used (and how He used you) you or spoke you clearly or delivered you powerfully...He's preparing you for something.

## 5. <u>A fourth way God leads that we can observe from our text is that He leads through</u> our circumstances.

- Having delighted themselves in God, He leads them out by their desires to Cyprus and first to Jews. <u>VV. 5-7</u>
- I think it's safe to say that they had not gone out targeting political rulers.
- Sergius Paulus was not a part of their schedule, but he was a part of God's schedule.
- <u>He was hard to miss</u>, but there are other interruptions to our schedule that may be.
- Remember:
  - 1. You don't have the whole picture...God will not give it all to you.
  - 2. <u>Changes, interruptions, opportunities</u> may just be God filling in more of the picture.
  - 3. <u>Maybe, it's something you don't want to do</u> or a direction you don't want to go but it keeps coming at you...**It just may be God!**
- <u>In the midst of you being faithful to what you feel God has called you to do</u>, don't be surprised when you get surprised by what may seem like deviation.
- <u>It just might not be a deviation; it just might be God's continued</u> direction for our lives bumping up against what we have decided we\_want to do.
