## Acts of Jesus, Lesson 31: Focused Lives, Part 2

## Acts 16:22-25

<u>The last time we were together</u> we took a look at the missionaries, Paul, and Silas, who, though in terrible circumstances, focused on the goodness of God.

- We saw that it has been proven that it's not our outward circumstances but our inward focus that determines how we feel/our reality.
- This one of many things that make worshipping God so import for our lives.
- <u>I left you last time sort of hanging;</u> I told you to worship, but I didn't give you the tools to accomplish that goal.
- <u>In my experience, the average Christian doesn't really know</u> what worship is; he thinks he knows because he attends "worship":
  - o But too often we attend church but don't worship
  - We sing songs but do not worship.
  - o We listen to preaching but do not worship.
  - o We too often mistake the means of worship for worship itself.

# 1. Oxymorons: A self-contradictory phrase

- Boring and Worship are contradictory/mutually exclusive words.
- Worship is meant to be the greatest grounding and stabilizing factor in a Christian's life
- The chief end of all that we have received from God.
- The most exhilarating experience that a human can possibly have.

### 2. So, what is worship?

- <u>Let's start our answer by considering a passage</u> that describes worship in its many forms: **Psalm 95:1-7**
- <u>Can you feel the focus that is implied here</u>...required here?
- Real worship is all about focus...all on God and nothing on you or your circumstances.

#### What worship is not:

- 1. Worship is not for our benefit worship is for God's benefit.
  - The focus is completely on God, not ourselves.
  - <u>If we come seeking a style of worship or a certain song</u> we immediately exempt ourselves from true worship.
  - <u>The typical Christian mindset about worship</u>: They think of themselves as the audience, the music leader and pastor are the entertainers
  - <u>Bottom line is that when we seek to "get something out of worship"</u> we are taking God's place and are in essence, committing idolatry.

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- 2. Worship is not about getting, it's about giving! I Chronicles 16:28-29, Ps. 29:1-2
- 3. Cannot be half-hearted
  - <u>Half-hearted worship</u> is not worship at all.
  - Someone has said, "We can worship God imperfectly, but we cannot worship Him insincerely."

### What worship is:

1. It is a summons:

- **V.1** "come" summons us into the presence of the Almighty.
- It is not optional for us.
- We come to Him because He came to us.
- We come on His terms...again it's not about us!
- 2. Something that God seeks: John 4:23-24
- 3. It is something that is intentional on our part.
  - Worship is not something that happens to you...you make it happen.
  - Paul and Silas had no stimulation from the outside to bring them to place of worship.
  - It is a decision that requires much effort.
  - You will never worship unless you mean to and want to.

- 4. Worship is a sacrifice. **Hebrews 13:15** calls worship and praise a sacrifice on our part.
  - It is giving up of focus on ourselves.
  - Giving up of our agendas.
  - Giving up mentioning to God our needs so the focus can be on Him.
- 5. Worship is an extreme expression of faith.
  - Worship says, "I don't have to worry about my situation or circumstances because You are in total control."
  - "I don't have to worry about my needs because You are going to meet them."
- 6. Worship is a matter of Obedience.
  - We come to church to be moved, but we don't want to move.

Coming to church is relatively chean but true worship is costly.

- "I want to feel good, God, but don't rearrange my life"
- We want to be moved emotionally, but we don't want to be moved obediently.

Worship is a matter of heart...a matter of Focus on God who has done so much for us.

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
