Bible Prophecy and the book of Revelation, Lesson 9

The Prominence of *Prophecies yet to be fulfilled in the Scriptures.*

- 1845 references to Christ rule on the earth in the Old Testament.
- 17 Old Testament books give preeminence to this event
- Of 216 chapters in the New Testament, there are 318 references to Christ's second coming.
- <u>Christ's second coming is mentioned</u> in 23 of the 26 New Testament books.
- For every prophecy of Christ's first coming, there are about 8 prophecies of His second coming!

Chapter 4 - Entering into the 3rd of 3 sections in Revelation (1:19) - don't ignore the God given outline.

- "After these things" is the way Chapter 4 begins...after what things? -- After the age of the Church.
- Beginning with Chapter 4 and running through the end of the book, the Church is never mentioned again.
- From Chapter 4 on, the book takes on a very Jewish flavor.

There is a scene shift here that will be maintained through the rest of book:

- **Chapters 1-3** John is on the isle of Patmos receiving 7 letters to 7 churches that existed at that time.
- **Chapters 4-22** John is in Heaven before God's throne.

Remember, this has historically been a very controversial book with many different interpretations coming from it.

- The only chance to come to a correct interpretation:
 - 1. Good, thorough knowledge of the Old Testament. 404 verses in Revelation but over 800 allusions to the Old Testament.
 - 2. Resist the temptation to speculate.
 - 3. The best commentary on the Bible is the Bible let the Bible speak for itself!
- Your best answer, until you have studied and stewed for years, is: "I'm not totally sure."

- **V. 1** <u>In my opinion, we must have the rapture</u> (catching up) of the church in view here.
 - Interesting that his call up is with the sound of a trumpet.

Two comings of Christ yet to be accomplished:

- 1. To remove His people Only for the Church, before the time of Wrath, only His own will see Him, "caught up to be with the Lord in the clouds".
- 2. To remove from the earth the usurpers return with His Bride and angels, in culmination of God's wrath, every eye will see Him.

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<u>The Rapture – No way to predict</u> because there is nothing prophetically that proceeds it.

<u>The Return for Vengeance</u>—is very easily predicted, in fact, that is the purpose of the remainder of Revelation.

- A key way to delineate between these two is the issue of immanence.
- <u>Consistently, out New Testament writers speak</u> of the immanent return of Jesus (can happen at any time and requires no previous events).
- This return is for the church but not for judgement.
- We know this because of the glaring absence of immanence in the Revelation scenario.
- Revelation requires scores of events to take place before Jesus' return.
- <u>In fact, is marks off for us exactly 7 years to the day starting</u> with a particular event that starts the clock ticking.
- From that event until the return of Christ, we can know there is exactly 7 years that's not immanence!
- On the other hand, the rapture is spoken of as immanent requiring no prior events or time span.
- Rapture: I Thessalonians 4:13-end, I Corinthians 15:51-54, John 14:1-3, Isiah 26:19-20.

God's practice in Judgement throughout time is to remove some, bring through some, and to kill the rest.

- 1. Noah, Enoch, Antediluvians
- 2. Daniel, 3 friends, Nebuchadnezzar
- 3. Sodom, Lot
- 4. Promised Land invasion, Rahab saved, Gibeonites

This is the scenario or Revelation: remove the church, bring the Jews through, kill the rest.

- V. 2 God is on His throne here; always was and always will be.
 - "Throne" occurs 45 times in the Revelation--occurs only 15 times in the rest of the New Testament.
- <u>V. 3</u> <u>What color is God?</u> The stones described here possess every conceivable color. (jasper is a clear stone: **Revelation 21:11**)
- **V. 4** Who are these?
 - <u>Elder = Presbuteros in the Greek</u> == where we get our word Presbyterian from.
 - Highest offices in the Church or leaders in Old Testament times.
 - What we have is the church and possibly Israel combined represented by these 24 elders
 - <u>Crown = stephanos not a ruling crown</u> (diademata), but an earned crown (never promised to angels, but to saints)
 - **Revelation 2:10, II Timothy 4:8** (earned therefore, not our salvation)

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These elders are in no other throne room scene in the Bible:

- **Dan 7, Isiah 6, Ezekiel 1 and other chapters in Ezekiel**. You never find these elders present., but you do in **Revelation 4, 5**.
- **V. 5** "<u>Lightnings, thunders, sounds</u>" very similar to what preceded the giving of the 10 commandments which came with great fear.
- **V. 6** <u>Every aspect we have seen thus far has its</u> symbolic representative in the Tabernacle of the wilderness
 - <u>Throne</u> == Mercy seat
 - 7 Lamps == Menorah
 - Sea of glass == The Bronze sea represents the word of God
- **V. 7** <u>Living Creatures</u> mimic <u>the four standards of Israel's camp in the wilderness</u>: Judah=Lion, Reuben=Ox, Ephraim=Man, Dan= Eagle –the same as the 4 faces of these creatures.

V. 8 – Same thing said about them in Isiah 6 . VV. 9-11
