## Acts of Jesus, Lesson 44: A Final Farewell, Part 3

## Acts 20:28-30

 $\underline{\text{We ended last time with Paul's admonition to}}$  the elders of the church at Ephesus to guard the flock  $\underline{\text{Verse 28}}$ 

- ✓ This is a theme that is quite common in the New Testament: Matthew 7:15, II Peter 2:1, Jude 3-4,
- ✓ Is there a real threat?
- ✓ Why would He use up so much of the inspired text if the threat were not genuine?
- ✓ <u>Not only does it stand alone as a legitimate threat</u> but is also confirmed years later as Paul wrote to Timothy from Rome. <u>I Timothy 1:3, II Timothy 2:17-18.</u>

## 1. Suffice it say that the church of Jesus Christ is always a threatened church.

- Satan never takes vacations.
- He uses people as his instruments.

Who are they?? They are non-Christians who are posing as true believers: Matthew 7:15-16.

✓ Wolves in sheep clothing.

**How do they get in?** They get in because of our carelessness:

- ✓ Verse 28 "take heed."
- ✓ Verse 31 "Watch"
- ✓ Watch the similar language in these passages: Matthew 13:24-25, 38-39 (tares look almost exactly like wheat except when they put on fruit.) II Peter 2:1-3; Jude 4; II Corinthians 11:13.
- ✓ Think about it: When do wolves come in? **At night** when its dark and sheep are sleepy **Zephaniah 3:3**.

## How do we spot a wolf?

- ✓ By their fruit
- ✓ What fruit should we be aware of?:
  - 1. False doctrine: I Timothy 1:3, II Peter 2:1-3, I Timothy 4:1-3
  - 2. False practices: Romans 16:17-18, I John. 4:20-21

Who's susceptible? All of are—all sheep can be taken down by a wolf if they are not careful.

- 1. The Alone are: Don't go at it alone.
- 2. The weak and sick are: Watch yourself when you are fatigued by difficulties and hard times:
  - ✓ <u>Wolves can run all night long and slowly wear down</u> their prey no matter how big and conditioned they are.
  - √ "Fatigue makes cowards out of strong men."
- 3. Young are: I Timothy 3:6.
  - ✓ Know that you are and make yourself accountable and stay in the flock.
- 4. The foolish are: I Corinthians 10:12, Galatians 6:1.
