# Bible Prophecy and the book of Revelation, Lesson 16

### **Chapter 11**

<u>This is where the focus becomes even more intense on Israel</u>; the focus is going to be not just on Israel but specific city: Jerusalem and on the future Temple that is to be built there.

- ✓ <u>Again, this is background/parenthetical</u> break between the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> trumpets. It's here so that we understand what's going on.
- ✓ There is a clear distinction between Jews and Gentiles in this passage:
  - 1. 2,000 years of just Gentiles (from Adam to Abraham)
  - 2. 2,000 years of Jews and Gentiles only (from Abraham to Jesus)
  - 3. 2,000 years of Jews, Gentiles, and the Church. (from Jesus to our present time.)
  - 4. 7 years it goes back to Jews and Gentiles. (The church is not mentioned after Chapter 3)

<u>Verse 1</u> – <u>One of 5 places in the New Testament that the rebuilding of the Temple</u> is required to understand the passage: <u>II Thessalonians 2:3-4, Mathew 24, Luke 21</u>, <u>Mark 13</u>

**Verse 2** – **Luke 21:20-24** = Jesus said the same thing.

- ✓ <u>42 months</u> <u>in Daniel 9 we learned that there is final week of 7</u> years decreed for the Jews and for Jerusalem.
- ✓ This was begun by the Antichrist signing covenant with Israel for 7 years.
- ✓ <u>Cut exactly in half when this Antichrist places himself</u> and his image in the Temple displaying himself as being God.
- ✓ This half is named 3 different ways in the Bible: **Time, Times, and Half a Time**; **42 months**; **1260 days.**
- ✓ <u>Last half is called technically</u> "The Great Tribulation".
- ✓ The entire period is referred to as the tribulation.
- ✓ <u>It is the most documented period of time</u> in the entire Bible.
- ✓ <u>The tribulation is not some fit that God throws</u> it is calculated, precise, and well documented much beforehand.

**Verse 3** – How long? 3 ½ years.

- ✓ Which half is this? First 3 ½ years because at the end of the last
- ✓ 3 ½ the antichrist/false prophet will cease to exist.
- ✓ <u>Sackcloth</u>==the appearance of an O.T. prophet.

**Verse 4** – Zechariah 4 speaking of a current situation and one yet to be.

**Verse 5** – What is this? Literal fire!

**Verse 6** – Who are these guys?

- 1. <u>Elijah and Enoch since neither ever died and</u> "it is appointed unto man to die and after that to face the judgment."
  - ✓ <u>Problem is that there are people</u> who died more than once (Lazarus, widows' son, Jarius' daughter, Dorcas, etc.)
  - ✓ Enoch was a Gentile not a Jew.
- 2. Elijah and Moses Matt. 16:28-17:4
  - ✓ They are given 4 "powers": 2 are unique to Elijah (shut up the sky, fire) James 5:17
  - ✓ 2 are unique to Moses (Blood and plagues)

**Verse 7** – Where does this guy come from? He has already been around for 3 ½ years and yet he has to reappear? Why is this???

- ✓ He's killed and resurrected and that is why people worship him.
- ✓ Not until his "resurrection" does he do all these supernatural things.
- ✓ He has a part I and a part II.
- ✓ <u>First, when he makes a 7 year covenant with Israel, and second</u>, he himself will break exactly 3.5 years to the day by setting up his image and himself to be worshipped in the Jews Temple.
- ✓ This requires several things logistically to be in place before he does this:
  - 1. <u>Israel has to be a nation</u> which it has not been since time of Christ but the Jews reconvened as a nation in May of 1948 (something that few thought possible)
  - 2. <u>Israel has to be in possession of Jerusalem and the Temple mount</u> this took place in 1967 in the 6-day war.
  - 3. <u>Israel has to build a Temple on its original site, which it has not done,</u> but which it is preparing to do.

**Verses 8-9** – How would they all see their dead bodies in such a short time?

✓ A dilemma for Bible teachers just century ago, but it's no dilemma today because of television.

#### Verse 10

✓ These guys were tough, and the Antichrist will be the star of this show.

## **Verses 11-12**

**Verse 13** – What city?? Jerusalem

✓ Rest? Jews mostly.

<u>Verses 14-15</u> – <u>Where are we in our timeline?</u> – <u>Verse 3</u> (first half or second?) first half because the second ends in the Antichrist's destruction.

- ✓ <u>Notice: the 7<sup>th</sup> trumpet begins the second half of the Tribulation</u> which is called the Great Tribulation.
- ✓ How can they say that it's done here so to speak when we know we still have 3 ½ years? Bowls are considered God's full wrath and reign.

**Verses 16-18** – This is basically a table of contents for the rest of the book.
