Acts of Jesus, Lesson 45: Paul's Journey to Jerusalem

Acts 21:1-14

✓ After over 20 years in ministry and missions, Paul returns for a final time to Jerusalem.

Verses 1-3 – Tyre was a port city in what is today Lebanon.

- ✓ Conquered by Nebuchadnezzar around 600 B.C.
- ✓ <u>In **Isaiah 23:1**, God predicted that both the harbor and the buildings</u> of Tyre would be destroyed, but Nebuchadnezzar didn't do either.
- ✓ "Well, I guess God was wrong", some would say. "He missed it", "the Word of God cannot be taken precisely or literally".
- ✓ <u>In 332 B.C. Alexander the Great did exactly what the word of God predicted throwing the materials</u> of the old city into the sea.

Verses 4 -14 – First impression might lead us conclude that Paul is making a bad decision here.

- ✓ <u>Looks like he's making mistakes</u>, <u>but all these apparent mistakes</u> are just that apparent and not real mistakes.
- **✓ What you have here are believers adding their opinions to the voice of the Spirit.!!!**
- ✓ Watch what he says again in **verse 11** That's what God said and that's all He said there is no "Don't go to Jerusalem" added on.
- ✓ Paul is following the leadership of the Spirit in going to Jerusalem and ignoring the contradicting voices of other believers.

1. There are several lessons we can learn here.

- ✓ One lesson is the lesson of steadfastness = doing what you know God has told you to do and sticking with it until its done.
- ✓ Paul does that guite well even in the face of bad advice.

The Second lesson we need to learn here is concerning advice: both giving and receiving advice.

2. Some general advice on advice.

- 1. <u>Good advice rarely comes lightly or hastily</u> here the saints don't stop to consider the grand scheme of things they just shoot from the hip.
 - ✓ Ask a strong Christian when looking for advice.
 - ✓ Don't listen to or give any advice that is not thought over and prayed over.
- 2. Refrain from giving or taking advice that have emotions tied to them:
 - ✓ The saints here are speaking from emotion and therefore don't give advice in compliance with God's will.
 - ✓ Emotions can lead you to say do almost anything they are very intoxicating they control you like alcohol or drugs.
- 3. <u>Be careful about giving and receiving advice to or from those you are close to especially if emotions are involved.</u>
 - ✓ The believers were close to Paul and loved him and were not good candidates for advice.

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3. Some advice on giving advice.

- 1. We all like to give advice; based on our text, we should give less advice than we do.
- 2. Give advice only to the degree that you have clear biblical principle underlying it.
 - ✓ <u>Did the saints have any Biblical principle underlying their advice?</u> no, they just said "don't go!!!"
- 3. They said don't go based on what? *Emotions* Which were based on what? Fear of suffering.
 - ✓ Now we all know God doesn't want us to suffer...right?
 - ✓ <u>Jesus told us take up our cross daily and follow Him</u>...a cross is not something you carry to a party!!
 - ✓ <u>Jesus told His disciples to follow Him and then left them</u> and us an unequivocal example of disregard for self-preservation.
 - ✓ <u>Advice based on preserving self with regards to ministry and spiritual</u> matters may not be good advice.

4.	The best advice may not be what the majority says: ✓ Paul certainly found that to be true.
