## Luke 9: Taking the Steam Out of Self-Esteem, Part 3

- Self-worth," "Self-love" and "Self-esteem" have one glaring problem "Self," God's got a big problem with "self," Luke 14:11; Luke 18:9-14.
- The Pharisee esteems himself, he loves himself, yet he's wrong about who he is, he's separated from the God who made him, and he goes away unforgiven.
- \$\to\$ Tax-collector is everything the self-esteem movement is trying to steer us away from: he abhors his life, his sin, he's broken, he's repentant, he knows he's entitled to wrath—yet he goes away forgiven and in a right relationship with the God who made him.
- ♦ What God is about is selflessness: Philippians 2:3-7.

## There is no such thing as self-worth because we are only worth anything in the context of God and never in the context of self.

- ✓ It's not who we are, but Whose we are.
- ✓ Let's consider the comparison between who we are and whose we are.

## Who we are:

- ✓ Sinners by nature and by choice Ephesians 2:3; 2:1
- ✓ David's view of himself: Psalms 51:5,
- ✓ Isaiah's view of himself: **Isaiah 6:5.**
- ✓ God's view of us: **Genesis 8:21**
- ✓ As Christians we are still worthless in and of ourselves: Romans 7:18-19, 24, Paul didn't have a problem, he considered himself to be the problem.
- ✓ Proverbs 3:5-8
- ✓ A requirement to follow Jesus is to hate your life: John 12:25
- ✓ We don't just have a problem we are the problem.
- ✓ There is no self-worth, nothing to esteem, nothing to love! **This is who we are.**

## Whose we are:

- ✓ We are the problem and Jesus is the solution. Rom. 7:24-25
- ✓ We are forgiven **Ephesians 1:7**
- ✓ We have purpose: Ephesians 2:10
- ✓ We are valuable: Matthew 10:29-31
- ✓ We are loved: Romans 5:5
- ✓ We are known: II Timothy 2:19
- ✓ We are exalted: Ephesians 2:4-6
- ✓ Not in who we are but Whose we are: **Galatians 4:4-7**
- / We are reliable because any Father is reliable

We have purpose because our Father has purpose,
