Luke 9:23 - Salvation is free, but discipleship will cost you your life.

- ✓ We saw that a disciple learns, loves, and lives the Word of God and that Disciples make disciples.
- ✓ Today: If we follow Jesus, He will make us fruitful.
- ✓ **John 15:1-5, 8** Vines and grapes are one of the most consistent illustrations of God's people throughout Scripture.
- ✓ Psalm 80:8; Jeremiah 2:21 He rescued them so that they could bring Him glory through the way they acted, thought, treated others, and their testimony to the nations around them of the excellencies of God.

1. Since God has rescued us, it is important for us to know why.

- ✓ God saved us through the sacrifice of Jesus so that we could be His.
- ✓ Now that we are His, He has planted us here for a purpose. Saved us so we could be His, left us here to bear fruit.
- ✓ **Ephesians 2:8-10** This is our purpose in life; not being happy, not growing old, making money, owning your own home, relaxation, having a family or anything else.
- ✓ Your purpose is God-ordained good works/bearing fruit.
- **2. God has Grape-expectations of us!** Our entire purpose of being here is this fruitfulness that God has planned for us.
 - ✓ There is a predominant thought among believers that God is just fine with us being saved and doing nothing else.
 - ✓ Here's Jesus' advice: Don't buy it! it's a very bad bargain Luke 9:24
 - ✓ Holding on to what you have, your ways, your plans, or your dreams is a huge mistake because you'll be missing what Jesus wants to give you.
 - ✓ "I'm going to heaven; how can I lose?" You're going to heaven, but you lose your entire purpose for being planted here—You lose your life here—don't buy that!
 - ✓ God planted you for one purpose, to bear fruit.

3. Understanding what God expects helps us understand the Christian life a whole lot better.

- 1) Jesus is the True Vine Verse 1—Being a vine in the spiritual sense is how Jesus relates to believers whom He has planted here.
 - ✓ The word for vine here actually is reference to the relatively ugly trunk of a grape vine.
 - ✓ **Isaiah 53:2;** This is how Jesus relates to us whom He has planted, so if we don't know this about Him, we will have a harder time relating to what He's doing in our lives as Christians.
 - ✓ The whole issue of discipleship begins with the mentality that we are here to serve Him and not the other way around.
 - ✓ Jesus is going to relate to us as a vine does to a branch. **John 15:16** we have an appointment we will be held accountable for.

Luke 9: If You Want to Follow Jesus, Part 5

- **2) The Father is the Vinedresser**; This is the farmer, the gardener. His primary task is to grow grapes.
- ✓ God's purposes and plans are very clear cut, no mysteries, or ethereal connotations.
- ✓ God has saved you and planted you so that you can produce fruit.
- ✓ God will relate to you like a gardener does to branches that he wants to bear fruit.
- ✓ Fruit is only produced one way.
- **3) We are the Branches** To say that the branch's job is to produce fruit actually isn't exactly true.
- ✓ Notice: Jesus doesn't say "I'm the vine, go and produce fruit"
- ✓ Notice: Jesus says, "Abide in Me and you will bear much fruit"
- ✓ Where does fruit grow on a branch? Near the end.
- ✓ Where do branches attach to a trunk? Near the beginning, the opposite end from where the fruit is at.
- ✓ Jesus doesn't say "go and produce fruit" because branches can't produce fruit—at least not by themselves.
- ✓ The Vine produces fruit through the branch.
- ✓ The Branch's sole job is to hang onto the Vine.
- ✓ Notice: Jesus says "Follow Me" not follow a list of rules or set of doctrines or dogmas.
- ✓ Again, where you abide is where you live—we saw this when we saw that a follower of Jesus abides or lives in the Word.
- ✓ So, we abide in the Word not so that we can just get smarter and be able spout Bible truths, but so that we can Abide in Jesus, a real person in a real, ongoing, lifechanging relationship.
