Acts of Jesus, Lesson 53: A Dead Man Named Jesus

- 1. Our text today doesn't allow us to forget the foundations of our faith.
 - ✓ The last 6 chapters of Acts have Paul in Roman custody, but he's there for a reason, to bear witness of Christ to his fellow countrymen and world leaders.
 - ✓ Paul is caught in political crack, but God uses the pressure to squeeze out of him some beautiful things like books of Bible such as Philippians and Ephesians.
 - ✓ Could God have fixed this situation no matter how much political red tape was involved? Of course! But He doesn't and it's for a purpose.
 - ✓ Never forget that no matter where God has you there is a purpose in it, seek that purpose.
 - ✓ Paul in Chapter 25 is before his second governor of Palestine in as many years who goes by the name of Festus.
 - ✓ Festus quickly and correctly evaluate the situation with Paul and especially the reason why the Jews have such a beef with him.
 - ✓ Acts 25:18-19 and Paul reaffirms the real issue before Festus, Agrippa, and his wife Bernice in Acts 26:8
 - ✓ This real is the issue, the **risen Lord**.
 - ✓ The life of Jesus is bracketed by two impossibilities: a **virgin's womb and an empty tomb**.
 - $\checkmark~$ Jesus entered our world through a door marked "No Entrance" and left through a door marked "No Exit".
 - \checkmark It's the door marked "no exit" that validates all the rest.
 - ✓ Paul wouldn't be where he is if the resurrection were not true!
 - ✓ He'd just be one more person following one more dead leader trying to promote that leader's now dead agenda.
 - ✓ It's because of that resurrection power that they hold Paul prisoner as was correctly evaluated by Festus.

2. Our freedom was earned by Jesus' sacrifice, but it was validated by His resurrection.

- ✓ His resurrection confirms a number of things:
 - 1) Tells us who Jesus is:
 - ✓ Jesus predicted this in John 2:18-21
 - ✓ Paul makes this even more clear: Romans 1:3-4 (not that He wasn't the Son of God before, but His resurrection proves it).
 - \checkmark Jesus proves He's the Son of God and the same as God Himself by rising from the dead.

- 2) It tells us He's up to something:
 - ✓ If Jesus is dead there's no problem treating Him as just a good teacher and a fine example.
 - \checkmark He can make no demands on me at all as a dead person.
 - $\checkmark~$ He's as inert as the dirt He's turned into if un-resurrected.
 - ✓ But if He's alive and not just alive but risen from the dead, then death no longer having power over Him forever, then I must ask, "What He wants of me".
- ✓ In Revelation, John saw a vision of the current ministry of Jesus. He saw Jesus dressed as a high priest and standing in the midst of Seven Golden lampstands.
- \checkmark Those stands represent His church and His role as High priest is to tend those lamps.
 - He puts fresh oil into those who are losing their fuel.
 - He snuffs out those churches who will not obey Him.
 - 3) Means He's coming back: Acts 17:30-31
 - 4) Means we have the Power to live for Him: Romans 6:4
