## Acts of Jesus, Lesson 54: Almost but not Quite

## Our lives are a series of interrelated moments, some are not significant, and others can impact us for the rest of our lives.

Acts 26:24 - There are many opportunities that will be missed by people that will come back to haunt them, but the greatest missed opportunity will be for those who just missed Christ. $\checkmark$ Like Agrippa, they were almost persuaded to accept Christ.

1. Many like Agrippa will hear the truth, but once they've heard there is an added responsibility.

## 2 Peter 2:21

$\checkmark$ You may think that almost is far better than being nothing at all, but it's not!
$\checkmark$ Almost $=$ Hell
$\checkmark$ Almost $=$ Lost

## 2. Many will almost get to Heaven.

$\checkmark$ But a person who almost gets to Heaven will still spend and eternity in Hell.
$\checkmark$ Agrippa got no points for being close.
Many Almost accept Christ for the same reasons that Agrippa Almost did.

1) Their position stops them. He was king, Mark 10:15
2) Their Possessions. He was a wealthy man, $\mathbf{1}$ Timothy 6:9
3) The Pressure, he sat with all eyes on him!
4) Their Procrastination. There'll be time to make a decision later, but you've already made a decision, John 3:18.
3. This is a story not only of those who fail to accept Christ, but also, of those who though they have accepted Christ, fail to serve Him.
$\checkmark$ Our opportunities to serve the Lord also come in a series of moments, moments that can make all the difference in our lives.
$\checkmark$ Almost obedience is still disobedience.
$\checkmark$ Our failure to grasp the moments in time to serve God faithfully can also cost others.
