Acts of Jesus, Lesson 39: Apollos

<u>We left Paul last time needing and receiving encouragement</u> - He leaves Corinth after $1\frac{1}{2}$ years ending what is called his second missionary journey.

Antioch from which he will start his 3rd missionary journey.

- <u>Between his 2nd and 3rd missionary journeys</u> we come to a parenthesis in Acts in which Luke introduces us to a man named Apollos.
- <u>He was destined to play a significant role in developing churches, especially in Corinth.</u>
- We are introduced to him first as an unsaved person.

Acts 18:24 - V. 24 – First of all, his credentials --- He was from **Alexandria** which was known for its educational prowess.

- <u>He was, no doubt, an educated man</u> with the equivalent of a graduate or even a doctorate degree.
- Adding to his credentials he was an <u>eloquent man</u> (a gifted communicator).
- <u>He was</u> "mighty in the Scriptures"
- "Instructed in the way of Lord"
- "fervent in spirit"
- "speaking and teaching accurately the things concerning Jesus"
- <u>Why did I call him unsaved?</u> Because the Scriptures indicate that.
- How can person be all that and still not be save? Because the Scriptures say that he wasn't.

Watch carefully what the Scriptures say about Apollos:

- 1. <u>They call him a Jew and not a Christian or a brother</u>.
 - Luke is pretty consistent about calling a believer a believer.
 - <u>This is our first indicator, and it doesn't</u> stand alone but the next one does.
- 2. V. 25c "being acquainted only with the baptism of John"
 - <u>The baptism of John was only a baptism of repentance</u> making a Jew ready to receive the Messiah.
 - <u>A Jew knowing only the baptism of John</u> had not yet received the Savior.
 - <u>They could tell you about the Savior from the O.T.</u>, but they had never met the Savior personally.
- It is possible for you to be a church member and faithful, and knowing about Jesus, knowledgeable of Biblical things, even teaching things that are accurate and still not be saved yourself. None of those things save you --- You must meet the Savior personally.

V. 26 – Apollos had a blank missing which despite his sincerity and accuracy, would keep him out of Heaven.

- <u>Every single person must have a personal encounter with the living Jesus in which you believe on</u> Him as Savior or else you will not see Heaven (**no matter who** you or **what your credentials** are).
- 1. <u>I am going to spend the rest of our time focusing on another point rises up out of this passage</u>.

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- **<u>V. 26</u>** this tells us a lot about both Apollos and Priscilla and Aquila.
- <u>First it tells us the kind of person Apollos was</u> high credentials, intelligent, yet able to sit down and listen to a couple of tentmakers.
- <u>Second it tells us about these two tentmakers</u>: the fact that they didn't call him down in public and that they didn't chastise him tells that these two truly had a heart for people.

This brings up the subject of encouragement again.

- <u>We looked last week at being encouraged</u> in the Lord and not giving up.
- <u>We need to not only look to the Lord for encouragement</u> but be encouragers ourselves.
- <u>Priscilla and Aquila's gentleness and encouragement</u> of this lost man was the springboard that turned him into one of the greats of the New Testament, period.
- That is just the idea of the word encouragement --- Greek = "to put courage in"

Heb. 10:24 – We need to think on how we can spark each other to press on.

2. I will give you three ways you can be a spark for people

- 1. Be committed to church: Heb. 10:24-25
 - <u>Got to be around each other</u> for encouragement to happen.
 - <u>Got to be involved in each other's lives</u> to know how to encourage.
- 2. Look for their potential: This couple saw potential in this man and gave him tremendous help.
 - Look for giftedness or any good and point it out to them.
 - <u>Sometimes we can't see our own abilities</u> and we especially can't when we are discouraged.
- 3. <u>Be gentle with people's short comings</u>.
 - This couple did not blast Apollos for his messed-up theology
 - <u>Remember how gentle God has been with you</u> (even allowed you to be wrong for a while) but still blessed you and encouraged you.
 - <u>People don't have it all together ---</u> encourage what they do have together.
 - Doctrine is important but love is more important.
- 4. <u>Speak prophetically to one another</u>.
- <u>I Cor. 14:31</u>
- <u>We over-spiritualize prophecy like it is only special people</u> at special occasions that are able to clarify what God is saying through His word.
- <u>Prophecy can be nothing more than an impression from God</u> concerning someone's situation.
- <u>A Scripture that might fit, a word of encouragement</u> that helps them gain perspective.

W. 27-28 – Look what happens when a changed, encouraged, and saved Apollos gets a fresh start!
