Jesus started his final journey to Jerusalem: Luke 9:51, but not before telling them that this time would be different: Luke 9:22; 44-45. Now, just a few months later, they are still making their way slowly through the towns and villages on their way to Jerusalem, and Jesus reminds them again what is about to happen: Luke 18:31. Everything in all of Scripture is pointed at this. Nothing matters more than this event in the entire Bible. Everything in the Scriptures is leading up to this or is looking back to this event. This couldn't be done remotely, Luke 19:10 and Matthew 20:28. He can condemn us remotely, in fact, Hell is essentially going to be about the remoteness of God, 2nd Thessalonians 1:9. But God saves us personally; salvation isn't a religion, and it isn't a formula, it is a person, Acts 4:12, you have to come to Him personally. God judges us impersonally and remotely: 2nd Thessalonians 1:9 and 2nd Samuel 23:6-7. The saved are His and go home with Him but the lost are left in the field to burn, Matthew 3:12.

1. God comes to us personally because saving us cannot be done remotely.

✓ It's not just that He has to be there, like the closing of a deal, to see it through, no, He is the deal and the closing: Isaiah 53:10, and 1st Corinthians 11:23-24. His hands broke the bread, John 10:17-18. This is why your salvation is between Him and you, it is personal.

2. Saving us was the first thing He scheduled in all of creation.

✓ We always talk about the order of creation: Genesis 1:1, but we fail include the totality of Scripture in our consideration. The Bible is an amazing document, brilliantly designed to deflect hostile attacks, where's the chapter or book on sin, salvation, forgiveness, Jesus, Heaven or Hell? We could lose a portion of Scripture and we lose some of its richness but we do not lose its message because its message is spread out across its entire bandwidth. The message of creation is mostly contained in Genesis 1 but it is not only in that portion; important notes on that event are scattered across the entire bandwidth of God's Word. Before God scheduled the heavens and earth, land and sea, light, moon and sun, He scheduled the death of His Son, Revelation 13:8. What a title! "Lamb slain before the foundation of the world" God never saw Adam and Eve working out; never saw the sacrificial system working out; never saw the Law as a means of salvation. It was always going to be Jesus, John 1:29.

3. Many see His death as a mistake.

They somehow think that Jesus' death was accidental, a sad misfortune or miscalculation. "He tried to show them the right way, but they killed Him, sadly"? Many books written indicating they believed Jesus was well intentioned but naïve and misguided crossing the wrong people which eventually got Him killed. I have no idea how you come to conclusions like that and claim to have read the Bible, pure deception; about as deceived as person can be. Just say you don't believe it, but don't say it doesn't say it. Saying that makes you look so dumb! Three times in Luke alone, Jesus warns His disciples that He was to be crucified.

4. This is scheduled: Luke 18:31.

✓ Salvation is God's plan but not ever any man's plan. It wasn't the disciple's plan: Matthew 16:21-22. Peter is the best informed of His followers and this isn't in his head at all. It wasn't in the plans of those who killed him: Mark 14:1-2 with Acts 4:27-28.

Tŀ	ney in no way saw Jesus as Savior or His death as God's will, they were just getting rid of a
	troublemaker in their eyes, yet they, in acting out of their free will, carried out the predetermined
	plans of God. Even though they had read the Scriptures that said they would do this to God's
	Savior, they had no idea they were carrying it out. "Let's go and finish what God began long, long
	ago" Luke 18:31. It is the primary event of biblical history, so it is the primary event of history.
